

AAC Target Phrase Data Sheet

AAC modeling, also known as Aided Language Stimulation, is an interactive process between an individual using AAC and their communication partner. As the communication partner, you can offer AAC modeling by pointing to icons, words, or letters on an individual's communication device while speaking. For example, while saying "I like that" you could point to an icon representing like. By using AAC while you talk, you are providing the individual with very important models of how to use their system to communicate appropriately and effectively. Because all people do not use AAC, this modeling really helps the individual learning to use AAC. Here are some suggest phrases you can both work on. Make a note about whether or not you modeled the phrase, or the individual used the phrase with (prompted) or without (unprompted/independent) your help.
